"Plans are useless, but planning is essential."






What will this all cost?

Your kits don't have to be expensive. Look for things you already own.

Take your time — add items as your finances allow.

No panic buying!

But set yourself a deadline.

How will you reach people you need to reach?

Designate an Out-of-State Contact

Local communication infrastructure will be damaged. It may be easier to reach someone far away.

Everyone in your household can call that person to coordinate messages.

Texting may work when voice does not.

Pick a spot near your home if your home is not safe.

As budget permits, purchase kit items in order of priority. (Hint: Start with water!)



55 gallon water barrels ~\$100 each



Make your plan a reality

Document and distribute your plans to the household.



It doesn't have to be fancy, and you can use templates from ready.gov as reference.

Important Information


